Jerlando F. L. Jackson is an Associate Professor of Higher and Postsecondary Education in Educational Leadership and Policy Analysis at the University of Wisconsin-Madison. He also serves as the Coordinator for the Higher, Postsecondary, and Continuing Education Program. He is a Faculty Affiliate for both the Wisconsin Center for the Advancement of Postsecondary Education (School of Education) and the Weinert Center for Entrepreneurship (School of Business).

Dr. Jackson's central research interest has been to explore workforce diversity and workplace discrimination in higher education. In addition, he serves as the Executive Director for the Center for African American Research and Policy, which is developing and publishing a new generation of research on policy issues confronting African Americans in both the academy and the society at-large. Frequently sought as a keynote speaker, he is credited with over 75 publications, 100

presentations, and has edited the books- *Strengthening the African American Educational Pipeline: Informing Research, Policy, and Practice* for SUNY-Albany Press (2007) and *Toward Administrative Reawakening: Creating and Maintaining Safe College Campuses* for Stylus Publishing (2007).

In addition, he conducts research on and evaluations of interventions designed to broaden participation for underrepresented group in STEM fields. Currently, he is the lead evaluator for three National Science Foundation funded projects: (1) African American Researchers in Computing Sciences; (2) PC2Main; and (3) Software Design and Development Teams Tournament.
